A CARVED PORTLAND STONE ARCHITECTURAL PEDESTAL

removed from Eton College, carved c.1905-8 by Abraham Broadbent (1868-1919) to designs by Laurence K Hall,

the inverted tapered pedestal with slightly bowed front panel, beneath an entablature incorporating a central raised rectangular panel flanked by guttae, the cavetto mould above spreading to the square edged top which returns in steps to the block back, unfinished to the sides and reverse where originally set into masonry; offered on an associated polished Portland stone slab base, also ex. Eton College,

HISTORY

The design of Eton's fabulous School Hall (built 1905-8) was awarded to a former Etonian – architect Laurance Hall – the decision being overseen by Norman Shaw. The Hall, together with a new library, formed a complex of buildings at the heart of the school *in memoriam* to the 129 Etonians who fell in the second Boer War (1899-1902). It was opened in November 1908 by Edward VII.
