HISTORY

This is a replica piece and also available through our printed catalogue. Constantine (AD275-337) was the first Roman emperor to convert to Christianity, yet here he is depicted in a battle scene with Minerva (Greek - Athena) originally a goddess of war but also a goddess of arts and learning.
