
DR. JOHNSON AFTER JOSHUA REYNOLDS

HISTORY

Samuel Johnson was born in 1709 in Lichfield, Staffordshire, become one of the greatest literary figures of the eighteenth century, most famously compiling *A Dictionary of the English Language*. He completed a critical edition of the works of William Shakespeare and created biographies and critical appraisals of 52 English poets of the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries for his *Lives of the Poets*.

Johnson gained a pension from George III in 1762, allowing him a more comfortable lifestyle, giving him time for travelling and talking Well known for his robust character and challenging and often hilarious conversation, Johnson was a sociable man, being a member of several Clubs and his circle of friends included the painter Sir Joshua Reynolds.
