



# THE PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE OF MODERN HOUSE CONSTRUCTION

An early edition of this set detailing the principles underlying the construction of houses in the nineteenth century. Under the editorship of architect George Lister Sutcliffe, this set contains the guidance of several authors on the construction of modern houses.
